BAINBRIDGE POLICE DEPARTMENT CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

The next Bainbridge Police Citizens Police Academy will be held **Tuesday, September 9, 2014 from 7:00 P.M. – 9:30 P.M. and will continue every Tuesday for Eight (8) weeks until Tuesday, October 28, 2014.** There is no fee to attend. All classes will be held at the Bainbridge Police Department. Applicants must be at least 21 years of age by July 1, 2013 and must be a resident or business owner in Bainbridge Township to attend. Applicants must not have any past Felony and or serious Misdemeanor convictions. All applicants must complete an application and are subject to a background check.

The Citizens Police Academy is an Eight (8) week program designed to give participants a working knowledge of the Bainbridge Police Department. The purpose of the academy is to increase citizen awareness of the day-to-day operation of the Bainbridge Police Department by educating them on topics relative to the role of the Police Officer in our community. The academy is NOT intended to make citizens into Police Officers, but to allow citizens to learn more about police operations. It consists of a series of classes and discussions involving the following subjects:

- * Crime Scene Investigations / Evidence Collection and Processing
- * Traffic / OVI Enforcement
- * Traffic Accident Investigations
- * Firearm Safety and Training
- * Patrol Techniques / K-9 Use
- * Legal Review / Laws of Arrest (Municipal ,Common Pleas Court)

During the sessions, students are presented with information about the above topics from a number of speakers to familiarize them with a variety of policing issues in Bainbridge. At the end of the Eight (8) weeks graduates are permitted to schedule a ride-along with a patrol officer for one evening. 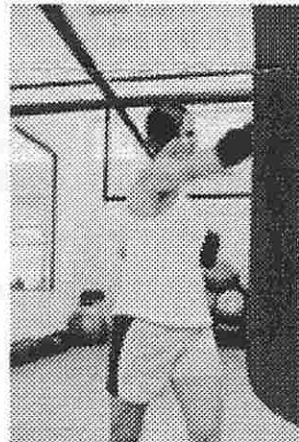
